

MSC Terminal Valencia increases its revenue by 23.9% to 147.8 million and doubles profits to 25 million



VALENCIA. The business of the **Mediterranean Shipping Company Spain** (MSC) terminal in Valencia, holder of the concession for the Valencian facility, closed the 2024 financial year with a **23.9% increase in its turnover, to 147.8 million euros, and a net profit of 25.1 million**, which represents doubling the results of 2023, when they stood at 13.7 million.

According to the accounts filed with the Mercantile Registry, operating profit reached **€36.5 million**, compared to €22 million in the previous

year, while profit before tax amounted to €33.5 million, compared to €18.2 million in 2023. In terms of employment, the average workforce stood at 100 employees, compared to 97 in 2023, and the average payment period to suppliers was 29.28 days, below the legal limit of 60 days.

The company's management report attributes the 2024 results to the **increase in business volume resulting from the reorganization of some services of the shipping company MSC** , which allowed for increased activity at the terminal and improved operational profitability.

Looking ahead to 2025, the company expects **to maintain a similar level of activity to the past year** , which is interpreted as a stabilization following a year of strong growth. The report emphasizes that the company will continue to rely on its **strategic position in the Western Mediterranean** , key to absorbing maritime traffic linked to MSC.

The document also highlights the decision by the **Port Authority of Valencia** to award Terminal Investment Limited, a company within the MSC group, the administrative concession to build and operate a new container terminal in the **port's Northern Expansion** . This award entails the future **termination of MSC Terminal Valencia's current concession in 2030** , which will be carried out by mutual agreement and with financial compensation planned by the Port Authority, in addition to the reversion of the non-removable facilities.

The company clarifies that, while this new project is being developed, the MSC terminal in Valencia will continue to operate normally under its current concession, fulfilling its traffic, investment and operating commitments.
